### Ongoing project: lettuce at 4130 m! Greenhouse primary school in miner's borough up and running.

Latest news from the greenhouse: June: By now the lettuce crops and tomato plants have grown so big they can be planted out. The children are enthusiastic and very proud. They hope they will be able to sell lettuce so they can buy new seeds for the next season!

**There are 5 new projects we would like to realize and for which we are looking for financial support:**

#### 1. Computer and Internet Project at High School Ckara Ckara:

Last year I visited a high school in a mining area where pupils could get a metalworking or computer training certificate in addition to their high school diploma. The high school has a good infrastructure and its staff members are well organized and very involved. In addition to computer training there is the very popular metalworking training in which many girls participate. The computer training is in trouble because the equipment is very outdated. By investing in new computers, peripherals, and an internet connection, motivated youth are given excellent new opportunities!

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An investment in this school increases the chances of these pupils to find better jobs and increases labor productivity in this area in the long term. In the fall the government will provide an internet connection so the 85 pupils will have access to an incredible amount of new knowledge and information. Look, I see a future for these youth!

Cost: € 9.113,- (Euros)

## 2. Project Centro de madres- Lajas:

In 2013, in the hamlet Lajas a group of about 15 madres (mothers) asked our help to create a Centro de madres, where they could come together to weigh the children, exchange experiences, support each other, and who knows: start a knitting studio.

The miner's wives had already made sure a building was constructed made of adobe (a type of sunbaked clay stones) and asked for our support to finish the center and furnish it. They want to work on a better future for their families and find a way out of the mining industry. By now a design has been made for a more durable and multifunctional building which offers them beautiful opportunities to develop themselves and the community. At this moment the local government and the target group are being consulted on the contributions they can make to the project. I think this is the start of something beautiful. Would you like to help by contributing?

## 3. Project There is some music in that!

The children in the suburbs of Potosí have usually been taken away from their original environment: the country side. Because of economic reasons they moved to Potosí with their parents: father has to go work in the mines. Often they cannot speak Spanish yet and have a hard time expressing themselves. But what makes them happy? Dancing and making music with the other children! And when you go to school feeling well, you learn more. In the urban environment the traditional norms and values are under pressure. Keeping these norms and values is very important for the purpose of keeping your identity.

In order to retain the knowledge of the traditional music using indigenous musical instruments a music teacher is hired for three months and the primary school 1. De Mayo San Ildefonso (200 pupils) gets indigenous instruments to use. What is needed? 1 pair of drums with drumsticks, 45 zamponas (panpipes), 1 pair of basins. And, of course, a music teacher for three months. In the beginning 45 students (10 – 15 years) will learn music, they form a music group that can be joined by other children later on. A good impulse for the primary education to mine worker's children in Potosí.

Cost: € 450,- (Euros)

#### 4. Project bread baking training

There is not much to say about the bread in Potosí: it is expensive, not very tasty, and unhealthy. Still it takes up a large place in the daily meals, especially for the poorest.

In order to invest in structural improvement in Potosí we support initiatives to set up new options for vocational training to attract the youth.

A recent proposal is to set up a project in bread baking training for both student bakers and current bakers, using the knowledge and experience from professionals from La Paz. A fine idea which is now being worked out. This will be our first co-production with our partner Fundación Autapo (Fautapo) who we mentioned in the previous newsletter. 150 students can participate, the training costs 9 euros per person  
Cost: € 1350.

#### 5. Project water tank number 8

Many single mothers (mine workers' widows) work as "guardias" (guards) of the mine entrances. They live in small adobe huts on the mountain - the Cerro Rico - with their children, in the unhealthy environment of the mines. On the mountain, however, there is no connection to the water supply. The government does not think this necessary because the mountain is considered to be an industrial area.

Halfway up the Cerro Rico, near the mine "Caracoles" there is a "center for education and nourishment" (childcare) set up for 30 to 35 children. They get breakfast, lunch, help with their homework and dinner. They are brought to school and then picked up again. The organization that set this up also offers education for adults for the mothers. The cost for all these provisions are covered by another organization (Musol).

There is a great need for a new water tank of 15.000 liter. That will be enough of a supply to send the children to school showered. The water that is left can be given to the mothers, under certain conditions, for instance taking work groups on health, hygiene and parenting. This would, after the 7 water tanks for the mine workers, be the 8th tank we build on the Cerro Rico.

#### Ongoing project: Furniture for the multipurpose center Hornitos

Sadly padre Efrain, a priest and street worker of sorts in a migrant district of Potosí is facing many difficulties. The project that has been made possible by a gift from "The little white church" in Haren, concerns the furnishing of the building. The building is not yet ready and now the doors have been stolen! What has been built so far is solid but it still needs to be finished. The furniture has been made by now but can of course only be

delivered when the building is finished. He is facing a shortage of € 2.600 (Euros). A very sad story from padre Efrain who is working so hard for the poor in Potosí; we hope a solution is found soon...

#### Also a foundation in Bolivia?

Board member Michiel Randag visited Bolivia in April 2014. The purpose of the visit – among others – was to find out how useful it would be to set up a sister foundation in Bolivia. He spoke about this, together with our coordinator Enrique, with some well integrated people in Potosí and a lawyer in La Paz. The outcome of these conversations was that juridically speaking it is very possible to set up a Bolivian foundation, with a board comprised of both Dutch and Bolivian members. We are searching for those now. It is also desirable because it offers the option to exert some more control on ongoing projects from Potosí and also to raise funds in Bolivia.

### Festive opening rebuild vegetable greenhouse

"During my working visit I (board member Michiel Randag) was present on April 14 for the festive opening of the vegetable greenhouse. This greenhouse had been heavily damaged shortly after it was built in the fall of 2013 by a tidal wave coming from the mountain. The walls have been repaired

using concrete weir and measures have been taken to avoid having to face this problem again. Enrique (our coordinator) and I received a warm welcome at the school. It was a great honor to raise the flag while the national anthem was being sung. All classes in the school have danced, sung, or performed beautifully. After many speeches, Martha -the head of the school- and I cut the ribbon and revealed the plaque. The inside temperature of the greenhouse was well above the outside temperature... This, in addition to the frost free water supply should provide the school with many fresh vegetables soon. The festivities were concluded with a festive dinner (different kinds of beans, corn, onions, potatoes and chicken) for everyone who was involved in the construction. It was great to see how happy everyone was. The construction and repair of the greenhouse has been made possible by actions in Schruns (Helen Bachmann) and Vandans (Willy Kamphuis) which has been rightfully mentioned on the plaque."
