In April I was in Potosí and we were able to present the definitive concept for two new projects: The Centre of Mothers in Lajas Tambo and the water supply for the after school care Caracoles. Everyone is very enthusiastic! Over € 25.000 is needed for both projects combined, so we will be working hard. All contributions are very welcome.

We visited Padre Efrain and finished phase 2 of the furniture project for the community centre Hornitos, which marks the completion of this project.

Also, an interview with our coordinator in Potosí: Enrique Paz, and a taste of the workshop vegetable gardening in a greenhouse for pupils of the school San Ildefonso.

Caracoles

The after school care is an OASIS on the mountain for the youth living near the mines. The care centre was started over 20 years ago by 2 palliris (women who work in mining) and consists of a central room, a kitchen, a homework room and a courtyard.

The plan concerns the extension and improvement of the water supply and the installation of sanitary facilities. It was officially presented on April 6th by civil engineer Franklin Sunagua. It will be a concrete 15:000 litre cistern, offering enough capacity for the next 20 years (based on a usage of 32 litre per person a day and a growth up to 52 people). A costly construction and operation, also because of the arduous terrain. The tank will be placed high up so there is no need for a pump. We make agreements on the maintenance of the installation and instructions for the children and mothers. They are very enthusiastic about the plan!

Franklin, the engineer, holds the project presentation using a blackboard; there is still no electricity here (yet). The construction drawings





circulate and everyone nods in agreement. This is what they want, a multifunctional building where one can get instruction (for example on hygiene, childcare, women's rights, civic duties, etc.) and start a sewing or knitting workshop. The accompanying toilet building with a septic tank and double washbasin is also very welcome: the roof blew off the current 2 (only!) toilets a couple of months ago.


Greenhouse project San Ildefonso

an outstanding course. The children were ecstatic and learned a lot during this special outing! At their primary school in Potosí they will pass on their knowledge and apply it in their own greenhouse.



Amigos de Potosí compels children to think about their futures



I'd like to introduce you to Enrique Paz (48), our coordinator in Bolivia, and ask for your support in his fondest wish: a motorcycle.

Enrique was born in Potosí, studied (philosophy) and worked in La Paz and Cochabamba, but lives since 17 years again at 4090 meters altitude. His work is his hobby: visiting small communities and work on projects with the population. He doesn't like to talk about himself, preferably he talks about the people and their traditions. He is a walking Wikipedia and always manages to fascinate me with his knowledge... When he has time he goes hiking or cycling, and loves music and classic cars.

Why do you do this work?

When I graduated it was a very difficult time for Potosí: the prices of silver and other minerals went into a free fall, many mines closed and the people had to look for other jobs and left. For people that couldn't leave, the only thing that remained was what they had already done for generations: work in the mines under medieval conditions. And that's how they, with their lungs, subsidised the prices of silver and other minerals. I was deeply touched by this.

What do you do and since when?

I have been with AdP since 2008, when we started focussing more on educational projects. Since 2012 I am coordinator of all our activities in Bolivia, which starts with receiving and assessing project

requests, for example from a school with no sanitary facilities. I assess if the project fits within the objectives and the policy of the foundation and perform problem analysis to research if the desired project is the correct solution for the existing problem. If that is the case, I talk with them about the conditions under which the project could be executed. Furthermore we discuss the way they could help themselves with the realisation of the project, and how implementation and maintenance should be organised. Together with them I expand this into a project proposal which I then present to the foundation. After provisional approval, the project plans are developed further with a budget, which is then again presented to the board.

I talk with a lot with people about their wishes and expectations, and about what the changes mean for their lives. I guide the execution of the project and lend a helping hand where I can. On the other hand I maintain the contact with the foundation's board in the Netherlands and take care of the project reports.

Why do you work for AdP, and why do you think AdP provides a good contribution?

AdP takes on very concrete tasks for a specific target group. AdP remains loyal to its objectives and is goal oriented in its acts for the population that lives in the world of the mining industry. AdP offers chances for a better quality of life and a better future, based on the population's own initiatives to escape poverty and marginality.

How does one know how to find you in Bolivia?

Because of the projects we have already done; good news travels fast!

Because of this I get lots of proposals, of which a large part are immediately denied since they don't fit within the objectives: they are agricultural projects, they are too complex, or they are too secluded making transport an even larger problem.

Why an even larger problem?

Transportation is very expensive in Potosí: especially when it comes to difficultly accessible roads (river beds) in the countryside; taxi's don't like that. I have no motorcycle or jeep, and with public transport you only have very limited coverage. A motorcycle would be ideal, also to ride up the mountain to the mines. Physicians and officials from the government or other organisations often use motorcycles, preferably European makes: those are stronger and more durable. It would make my work a lot easier...

Is there a future for the youth in Potosí?

We can't tell yet (at this point), but luckily we already notice that children, parents, teachers and authorities concern themselves more with the future. We also notice that, because of the improvements (such as computers and internet) in the educational system, they indeed do have better opportunities for the future. This is a

huge motivation for me to continue with this work. We start something, give people confidence and perspective: that really changes something.

Enrique wants to buy a motorcycle and we want to give him a contribution.
