



## ***Eighteen years of projects which help miners and schoolchildren in Bolivia!***

*In May 2012, the foundation Amigos de Potosi officially celebrated its tenth anniversary. However, we have of course been working hard a lot longer than that! In 1994, we donated a radio to the first aid post so that they would be capable of contacting the emergency services if there was an accident. That's where it all began.*

*In the years that followed, we helped with another big problem: the shortage of water on the Cerro Rico, the mountain where the miners work. During that time, we built seven water reservoirs which were put to very good use as they provide water to hundreds of miners each day.*

*Another major problem is the use of child labour in the mines. We help combat this through investing in education, especially in the rural areas that surround Potosi. With computers, the internet, sanitation, greenhouses and other quality investments, education is made that much more interesting for both students and teachers alike. Through school and training, these youngsters have a better chance of finding a job outside of the mines. It's clear that nobody should do such dirty, dangerous work; least of all children!*

### ***And why does our concept work?***

It is their ideas that are executed. We don't come up with solutions because that's something they can do themselves and a lot better than we could. The people help themselves. They personally contribute in the form of manual labour and transportation of materials or meals. All this increases their involvement and responsibility. They are small manageable projects. One becomes the owner and there are no high operating costs. Our local volunteers supervise the project and regularly report to us. With regular reporting and photos, we keep donors and sponsors well-informed.

### ***There is much to be done over the upcoming months!***

Three storytellers are working on a story/drama production; my cousin Helen Hesselink will soon organize a Zumba-event in Austria; Two professionals from the world of art and music have given their commitment to organising events; high school students will organize an event for charity, the website will be updated and there will be ideas developed and given to businesses who are interested in sponsorship.

There are so many great things happening with regards to attention and support for the work the foundation does!

Meanwhile, we receive more and more support from associations, organisations and clubs. This helps us spread our story even further.

We just want to stress that any and all help in any form are more than welcome!

*More and more enthusiastic people are stepping up to support our work. This isn't just financially. It also comes from people thinking with us and people who aren't afraid to get hands on.*


*In chronological order:*
